**ORDER**

---

**UPON** the Applicant's *ex parte* on notice Application for Leave to Apply for Judicial Review and an Interim Stay dated 26 March 2025

**AND UPON** hearing leading counsel for the Applicant and leading counsel for the Respondent.

**AND UPON** the Respondents not making full representations to the court on the matter of the application for leave for judicial review given the short notice of the date of the inter partes hearing set by the Court, and the Court noting as well that the Interested Parties were not present at the hearing

**AND UPON** it being agreed between the court and counsel for the applicants and for the Respondent that a rolled-up application for leave and, if granted, for judicial review could be heard within a short period.

**AND UPON** the Court considering its discretion to order interim relief, being satisfied that the Applicants had demonstrated that it should exercise this discretion in the circumstances of this case, being mindful that any order of the Court regarding the application for a stay of the decision for which leave to apply for judicial review is sought, if made, will affect not only the Respondent but also the Interested parties and having in mind that the decision sought to be challenged is that of a public body which should be respected until set aside.

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT: -**

1. The application for leave to apply for judicial review and, if granted, the application for judicial review shall be listed on a “rolled up” basis and shall be listed to be heard on 15 – 16 May 2025, before Carter J.
2. The National Conservation Council shall not make any decision pending the final determination of the claim for judicial review or further order.
3. The National Conservation Council may apply to vary or discharge the Order at paragraph 2 of this order on 72 hours’ notice to the Applicants and the Respondent.
4. Costs reserved.
